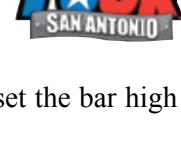


INDIANAPOLIS & SAN ANTONIO NET THE FINAL FOUR



CSC had the privilege of providing services for both the Men's and Women's 2010 NCAA Final Four Tournaments. The Men's Final Four was hosted by Lucas Oil Stadium and included the Butler Bulldogs, Michigan State Spartans, Duke Blue Devils, and West Virginia Mountaineers. CSC provided ticket taking, ushering, crowd management, and 24-hour security as the top-seeded Duke Blue Devils took home the championship with an exciting 61-59 win over the fifth-seeded and crowd favorite Butler Bulldogs in front of more than 72,000 cheering fans. CSC Indianapolis also provided services at the Indiana Convention Center for Bracket Town, the ultimate Final Four fan fest. **Bill Stewart**, Lucas Oil Stadium Director of Security, said, "These events gave us the ability to showcase our facility; and our staff the experience necessary to provide our famous Hoosier Hospitality." CSC has been providing services for Lucas Oil Stadium and the Indiana Convention Center since 2002 under the direction of **Barney Levensgood**, Executive Director, **Michael Fox**, Stadium Director, and **Bill Stewart**, Director of Security. This year marks the 6th Final Four for the city of Indianapolis, and **L.J. Wright**, Director of the Division I Men's Basketball Championship, said, "Indianapolis has once again set the standard for hosting the Final Four. Furthermore, **Mike Fox**

and his staff at Lucas Oil Stadium have set the bar high for future hosts."

The Women's Final Four Tournament was held in San Antonio, Texas at the Alamodome and featured the Baylor Bears, Connecticut Huskies, Oklahoma Sooners, and Stanford Cardinals. CSC provided bag check and access control services for the thousands of excited fans as the Connecticut Huskies claimed another championship victory in the final game against the Stanford Cardinals. This win for Connecticut brought home their seventh national championship and highlighted a second consecutive undefeated season and a 78-game victory streak. This was the 5th Final Four for the city of San Antonio, including the 2002 Women's Final Four which still holds the record for the largest crowd to ever attend a women's NCAA basketball championship. CSC has been affiliated with the Alamodome since 2002 and provides services under the direction of **David Lucero**, Alamodome Event Services Manager. CSC also provided services for Tourney Town, the women's Final Four fan fest experience which was held at the Henry B. Gonzales Convention Center. ■

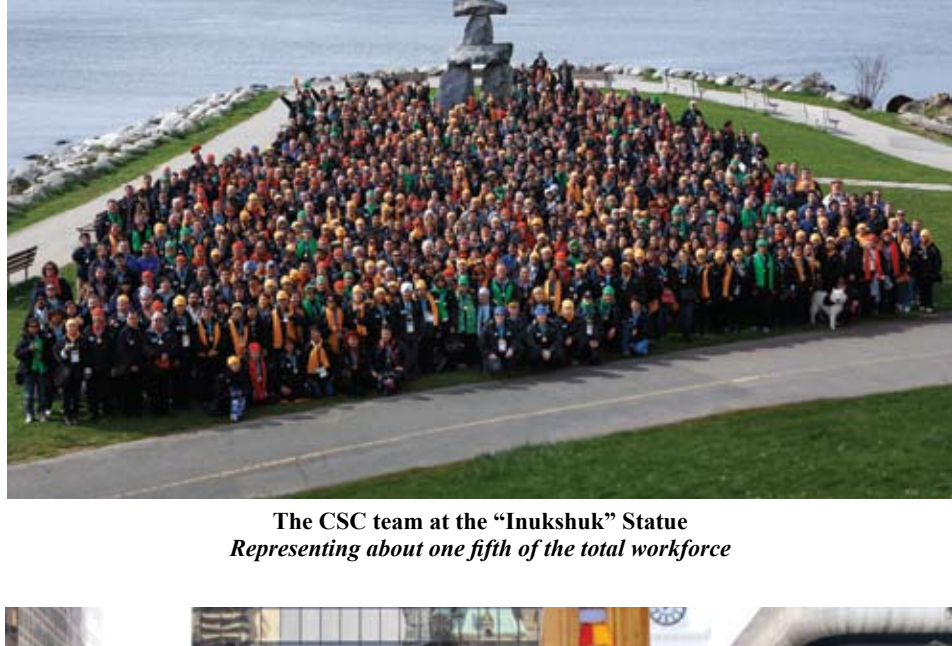
FAREWELL TO THE 2010 VANCOUVER OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES

Following the successful completion of the Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Games, CSC's sister companies, Contemporary International Canada and Contemporary Security Canada, offer an overview of their work, including their years of planning and a glimpse of what projects are on the horizon.

CONTEMPORARY SECURITY CANADA SECURITY CONTRACT

In April 2009, Contemporary Security Canada (CSC) was awarded an unprecedented government contract with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) to provide the Security Services for the Vancouver 2010 Games. Armed with years of experience and tasked with the enormous responsibility of keeping the Games safe, CSC's participation was extremely successful due to immense planning, operational expertise, and skillful execution. CSC hired over 200 people to be part of its Central Planning Team prior to and during the Games. The challenge for CSC was selecting the best representatives out of the more than 7,000 resumes that were received. As a result, the Central Team was made up of a very select and talented group, all of whom contributed to the success of the Games. CSC also hired and trained approximately 7,500 Games Security Screening staff members. This included Screeners, X-Ray Operators, Screening Supervisors, Communication Operators, Communication Supervisors, Deployment Team Members and Deployment Supervisors.

During both the Olympics and the Paralympics, CSC filled more than 100,000 work shifts and completed over 1,000,000 hours of paid service. The team is now in the process of wrapping up the project, which includes reclaiming all assets, reviewing all Games operational data, finalizing payroll for all staff members and dismantling the CSC residence camp that was built to house the security staff in Whistler. The CSC team contributed greatly to the safety of the Vancouver Games and its participation has been regarded as very successful. ■

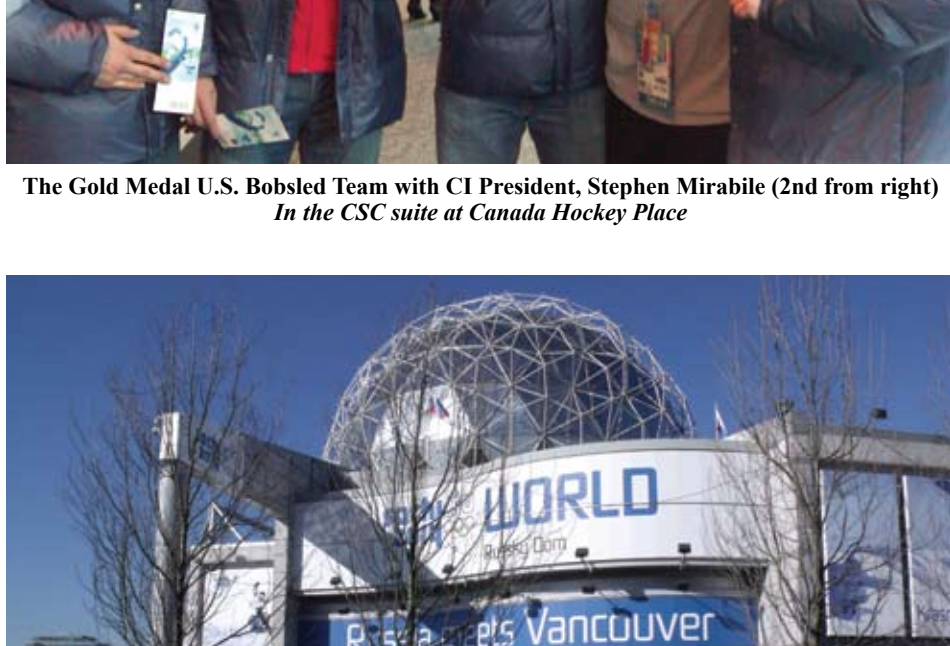

CONTEMPORARY INTERNATIONAL CANADA EVENT SERVICES AND ASSET PROTECTION CONTRACTS

Contemporary International Canada (CIC) began discussions with representatives of Vancouver 2010 more than five years ago, even before the 2006 Torino Games. This sales cycle is typical for Olympic Games, which require a long lead time of planning and research. The first contract that CIC obtained was with the Vancouver Organizing Committee (VANOC) to deliver Event Services for the 2010 Games. Drawing on its extensive Event

Services experience gained at six prior Olympic Games, the CIC team hit the ground running in planning operations for the competition venues in both Vancouver and Whistler. Six months into the project, VANOC increased CIC's scope of work by adding the non-competition venues into the Event Services operations to ensure the highest level of consistency in the delivery of the guest experience. As the Games drew closer and VANOC

continued to assess its needs, the CIC team was also approached to plan, staff and implement the Asset Protection program for the Games. CIC played an instrumental role in the overall success of Vancouver 2010 by safeguarding the Games' venues and delivering the highest level of service for over 350,000 international attendees. ■

The 78th Annual Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo recently concluded following a 20-day run that shattered previous attendance records while providing great entertainment, showcasing Texas agriculture, and promoting Western heritage. Originally established to promote and maintain research and education within the livestock industry, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo has committed more than \$250 million in educational support for Texas youth since 1932. 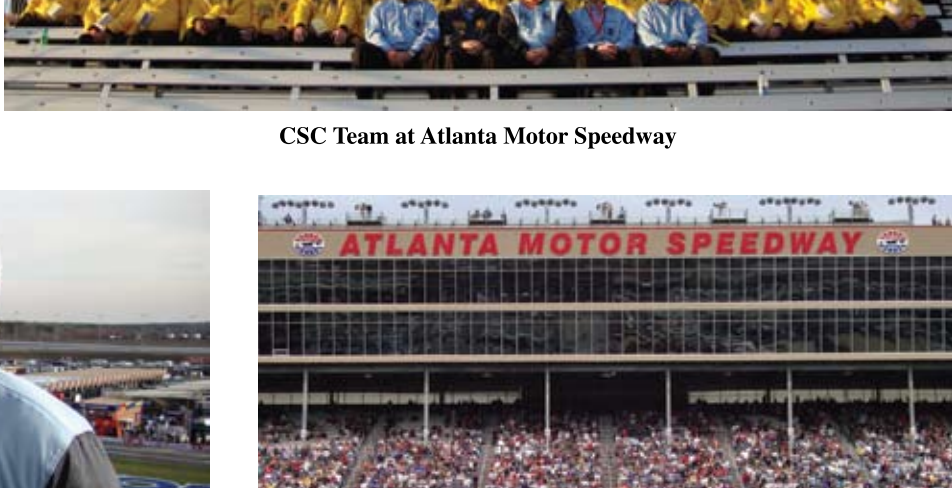

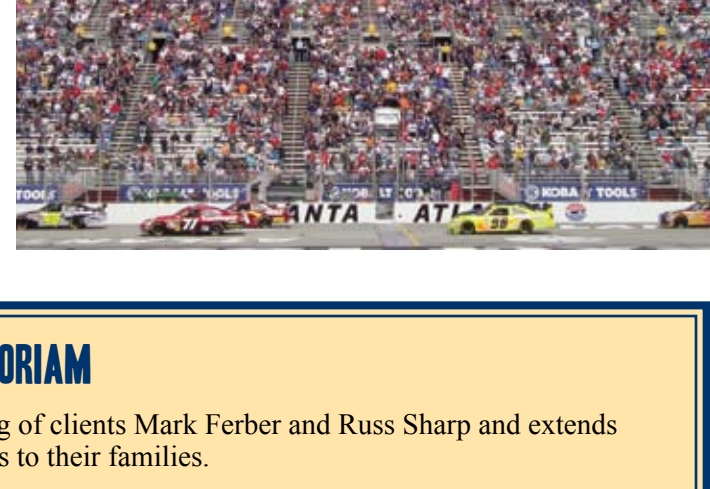
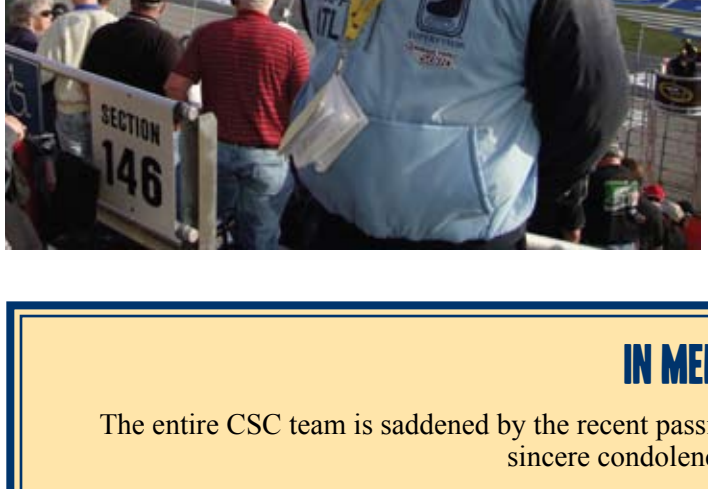
ATLANTA HOSTS KOBALT TOOLS 500
